# **Community Centre:**



February saw the complete demolition of the **Nantawarra silo landmark**. It was built in 1956 and was the FIRST CONCRETE VERTICAL SILO built in South Australia, when bulk handling was introduced. Bulk handling revolutionised the agricultural/grain industry in SA.

### NEW LAWS - from 1 February 2024:

The Tobacco and E-Cigarette Products (Smoking bans) Amendment Regulations 2023 have specified a number of outdoor areas that will be required to be smoke and vape-free from 1 March 2024. The changes will be of most relevance to sporting clubs.

Smoking and vaping will be banned in all public areas at or within 10 metres of a sporting venue at times when an under-18 years sporting event is occurring. Additionally, this will also apply during a training or practice session to prepare to participate in an under-18 years sporting event.

At Lochiel, the areas of concern are - playground, public toilets, town hall, and the oval, tennis/netball courts, & playground when children are present. We seek everyone's help in abiding by these new South Australian laws. Smoking, and now vaping, are banned in all buildings.
